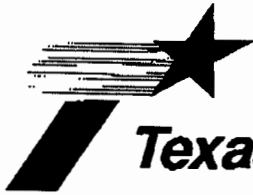
We will continue to support the economic development for the City of Taylor, and we look forward to recognizing future achievements there. Once again, congratulations!

Dear Congressman Carter:

This letter is to inform you that the Texas Department of Transportation, acting for and on behalf of the Federal Aviation Administration, offered an airport improvement grant to the City of Taylor on September 7, 2005, for the Taylor Municipal Airport in the amount of \$479,556. The financial assistance will be used to design and construct a hangar facility.

Federal funds have been approved for seventy-five (75) percent of estimated hangar costs and the City of Taylor has responsibility for the remaining twenty-five (25) percent.

We are pleased that the Department of Transportation has been able to participate in this much needed air transportation project. We will continue to support the economic development efforts of the City of Taylor as they relate to the improvement of their aviation facilities.
