Southwest Milam Water Supply Corporation has filed an application to amend and decertify portions of CCN No. 10027 with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality to provide water utility service in Burleson, Lee, Milam, Williamson Counties.

The proposed utility service area consists of facilities plus 200 foot along lines located between 10 and 35 miles east of the City of Taylor, generally including the area around the cities of Thorndale, Rockdale and Milano, bounded on the north by Farm-to-Market 487, on the east by State Highway 36, on the south by Farm-to-Market 696 and on the west by Farm-to-Market 619 and Farm-to-Market 1063.

The total area being requested consists of approximately 70,700 linear feet, or 650 acres and 17 current customers.

The Executive Director will issue this CCN unless one or more persons file written protests and/or a request for a hearing within 30 days after this notice is provided. To request a public hearing you must state (1) your name, mailing address, and daytime telephone number; (2) the applicant's name, application number or another recognizable reference to this application; (3) the statement, "I/we request a public hearing"; (4) a brief description of how you or the persons you represent, would be adversely affected by the granting of the application for a CCN; and (5) your proposed adjustment to the application or CCN which would satisfy your concerns and cause you to withdraw your request for a hearing.

within thirty (30) days from the date of this publication or notice. A public hearing will be held only if a legally sufficient hearing request is received or if the Commission on its own motion requests a hearing. Only those individuals who submit a written request to be notified of a hearing schedule will be notified if a hearing is scheduled.

If a public hearing is requested, the Executive Director will not issue the CCN and will forward the application to the State Office of Administrative Hearings (SOAH) for a hearing. If no settlement is reached and an evidentiary hearing is held, the SOAH will submit a recommendation to the Commission for final decision. If an evidentiary hearing is held, will be a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court.
